

7 Ways to Make the Most of Your Word of the Year

Choose One Word to Inspire Your Year

Instead of making a long list of resolutions on New Year's Eve, choose one word that motivates you. One word that inspires the next 365 days. There are probably many things you want to accomplish in the next twelve months, many ways you want to grow, but it is helpful to have a single focus.

To choose your word for the year, begin by asking God to guide you. Then ask yourself questions like:

- What is my greatest need? Courage? Peace? Friendship? Joy?
- Where do I sense God wanting me to change? Generosity? Kindness? Faith?
- What words have recently touched my heart while reading Scripture? Grace? Discipline? Hope?

Make the Most of Your One Word

Now that you have chosen your word of the year, this workbook has seven ways you can make the most of it, seven methods to help you learn and grow throughout the year.

1. Make Your Word Visible

Post your word in a prominent place where you will be reminded of it often. You can do this by simply writing it on a chalkboard or using your computer to print your word in a cool font. You can also use online tools to design an image that reminds you of that word in a visual way. Use free photo sites like Unsplash or stocksnap.com to find a photo. Then use a photo editing site like PicMonkey or Canva to add your word to the photo.

2. Find Scriptures

Use a concordance or online Bible like BibleGateway.com to find scriptures that contain your chosen word. Consider choosing one "theme verse" for the year.

3. Memorize Verses with Your Chosen Word

Memorize a few of the verses you found in Scripture. Regularly reviewing them will imprint them on your soul. As you meditate on them, you will give the Holy Spirit opportunity to teach you more about how this word applies to your life.

If you don't like memorizing, write out the verses on sticky notes and post them prominent places in your home. Review them while you're brushing your teeth or washing the dishes.

4. Discover the Meaning of Your Word

To fully understand your word, look up the meaning in a dictionary or Dictionary.com. Get more insights into the word by looking up the Greek or Hebrew word on the site Blue Letter Bible.

To find the Greek or Hebrew word:

- Type the reference of one of your chosen verses into the search box on Blue Letter Bible
- Click on "Tools" next to your chosen verse
- Find the English word and click on the Strong's number of the corresponding Greek or Hebrew word. This will take you to the definition of the word used in the original language of the verse.

6. Read Through the Bible with Your One Word in Mind

If you have the habit of reading through the Bible each year--or if it is habit you want to start--pay attention to where your one word pops up as you read. This is more than simply finding that word in a verse, it's paying attention to where the topic is discussed or where biblical characters experienced the concept. For instance, one year I read through the Bible looking for instances of friendship with God. I noticed places where the word friend was used like Exodus 33:11, "Thus the Lord used to speak to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend." But I also paid attention to stories of intimacy with God like Abraham in the Old Testament and the apostle John in the New Testament.
